National Renewable Energy Priority List

We are proud to announce that Bashan Wind Farm has been hand-picked for inclusion in the inaugural Renewable Energy Project Priority List, one of 32 renewable energy projects to be selected by the Federal Government for assessment. The criteria for selection were based on meeting Federal Government targets and priorities in the areas of energy, environment, and heritage.

What this means for local communities is that additional funding will be provided to support community initiatives in and around the project area. We look forward to discussing this further with neighbouring communities throughout this year, with a focus on hearing from Dee Lagoon, Waddamana, Bradys Lake, Osterly, and Stricklands residents – see events calendar overleaf for details.

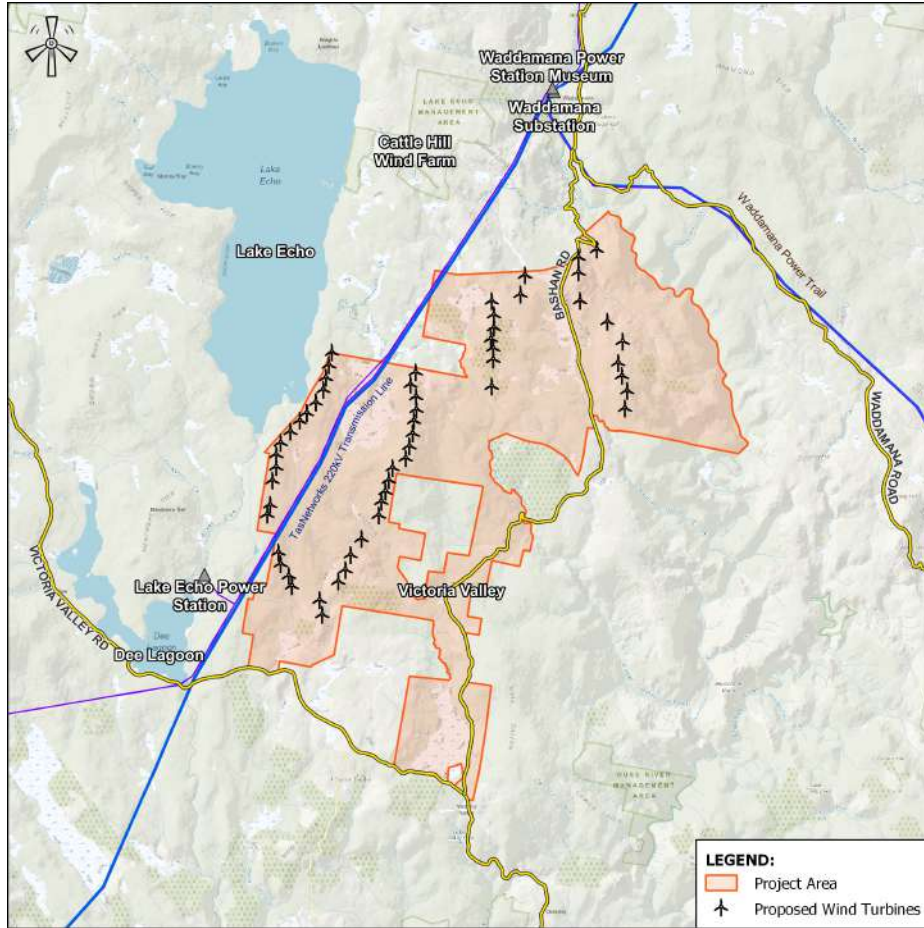
Community Consultation

Project Specific Guideline for Environmental Impact Statement open for comment

Following submission of the Notice of Intent to develop the Bashan Wind Farm Project in October 2024 to EPA Tasmania, the EPA has now released its Project Specific Guideline for the Bashan Wind Farm. This document outlines the matters that we (i.e. the proponent) need to respond to in the Environmental Impact Statement.

EPA will be issuing the Project Specific Guideline (PSG) for the proposed Bashan Wind Farm near the end of March 2025. Please look out for the PSG on the EPA website and provide any comments or feedback to EPA via the formal process outlined by EPA.

EPBC Referral Decision Published

Following submission of the EPBC Referral for the Bashan Project in October 2024, the Commonwealth Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (DCCEEW) has finalised its determination. DCCEEW reached the same planning conclusion we did – that the Bashan project is a Controlled Action under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999.
